A History of Indiana Chenoweths

Indiana is in the heartland of the Chenoweth migration west from Virginia. In order, by what was available, the family had moved into Kentucky and Ohio. Indiana followed shortly after. Indiana was formed into a separate territory from the Northwest Territories in 1800. By 1816 it entered the Union as the 19th State. Probably the first Chenoweths in Indiana were those in the Jefferson Co., KY area crossing the Ohio into Floyd Co. Looking specifically at the Chenoweth name: John Chenoweth, IV of Virginia, settled in the Washington Co. area from Ohio by 1813. John Chenoweth, son of Thomas(2) was in Vigo Co., shortly thereafter, dying in Vigo Co. in 1818. The first Census to include Indiana in 1820 finds 5 Chenoweth named families: John in Washington Co., Abraham, William's son, in Jackson Co., Thomas the son of Richard of Louisville in Jefferson Co., and two of John's sons Eli and Isaac in Vigo Co. These were the Virginia families of John(2) and Thomas(2) coming via Kentucky and Ohio. Among daughter lines, Elizabeth Casebier's family was in Spencer Co., IN, living next door to the farm of Thomas Lincoln. Barbara Martindale, from Warren Co., OH had settled in Wayne Co. Katurrah Kinnear, the daughter of Thomas in Jefferson Co. had started a family, having married there in 1818. Though not many of Hannah's Carter line ever came to Indiana, John Rees, Jr. was in Fayette Co. by 1820. The line of William(2) was strongly represented by families of his daughter Mary Sutton who also came to Fayette Co. There was the family of Joanna Heaton, a daughter of Mary Sutton, who like the Rees family, had come from Washington Co., PA via Ohio. Also found in the Sutton line in Fayette Co. were Ebenzer Heaton, Jr., Nancy Heaton who had married James Sutton, David Sutton and his daughter Ivah Petro, next door. In the Thomas Line, John's daughter Sarah Lewis was in Vigo Co. This puts at least 16 families in Indiana by 1820. Arthur of Kentucky, the father of Abraham's wife, Rachel, settled his family in Bartholomew Co. shortly thereafter dying there in 1829. His son Arthur is found there in 1830.

Other 1830 Census Chenoweth families were: In the Thomas line, John and Isaac, sons of John, had moved from Vigo Co. to Vermillion Co. Thomas III had also come to Vermillion Co. from Franklin Co., OH. His brother Benjamin Franklin Chenoweth was in Warren Co., IN. Hiram Chenoweth, Arthur's son had also come to Vermillion Co. from Pike Co., OH with his widowed mother Susannah. Within the next three years three of her children, Harriett, Luke and Permelia would each marry in Vermillion Co. Susannah's married daughter Ada Boswell would settle in Tippecanoe Co. by 1835. In the line of John, Rachel and her husband Abraham moved to Barthlomew Co. where Rachel's brother Arthur was still located. William's son Casper came to Wayne Co. from Warren Co., OH. In Washington Co., John IV's presence exploded with the married families of his sons and daughters, including Joseph, Eleanor Wilson, Rachel Hollowell, Philip, and Elias. Into Jay Co., came William E., the son of Elias of Perry Co., OH. Richard's son Thomas was still in Jefferson Co. and his son James had married and settled in Johnson Co. This totals 15 males line families. By 1840 this had grown to 23 families. The 1850 Census gives 50 Chenoweth named families and another 120 daughter line families totaling 857 family members spread over 42 counties. Only Ohio had more family members.

Many of these families had come in from Ohio and Kentucky. There was also the significant immigrant to the Chenoweth families of William of Hampstead in Carroll Co., MD that settled in the Randolph Co. area in the 1840's. By 1860, these numbers would swell to 252 families and 1,243 individuals. 112 of these families were from the lines of John(2). Roughly a third of these were from John(3) of Hampshire Co. They included 18 families from the original migration of John IV, 16 of which were concentrated in both Washington and neighboring Orange Cos. 13 families of William S. located in Miami, Huntington, Wayne, Stark and Wabash Cos. Six families were from James in Henry and Carrol Cos. Three families from Mary's marriage to Levi Ashbrook, Jr. were in Hendricks Co and three families from Elias were in Jay Co. From Kentucky 14 families from Richard were now in Indiana and, 13 from Absolom, Jr., 8 from Arthur, and 28 from Rachel. Many of Rachel's lines and the Chenoweth families of Ephraim, the son of Absolom, Jr. were concentrated in Morgan and Owen Cos. Mary's Ashbrook families numbered 8 in total from the Fairfield Co. area of Ohio. There were still three Rees families from Hannah Carter in Carroll Co. and the family of Sinah Horn in Cass Co. The presence of Arthur(2) through a series of late migrations from the Maryland families of Arthur, Jr. and the Virginia families of John and Samuel numbered 21. Seven of these were in Randolph Co. William(2) now had 53 families in Indiana. Most of these (47) were from Mary Sutton, who had such a large early presence in the State in 1820. The other six were from William, Jr., primarily, Warren Co., OH families. In slightly larger numbers were 59 families of Thomas(2). 14 of these were from John(3) who had settled so early in Vigo Co. 12 were from Thomas, Jr., 4 from Arthur and 17 from families of Richard who had settled primarily in the Tippecanoe Co. area in the 1840s. Rounding out Thomas were 5 families from Mary Downing, 2 from Elijah and 5 from Abraham. Three families from Ruth, who had come from Georgia into Ohio and settling in Fulton Co. brought the family representation to 6 of the 8 lines of original family. Only Richard's families, still primarily located in Maryland, Tennessee and Arkansas, and Mary's Watsons, never yet identified, were missing from the mix. Ironically, there was not one family from John(2)'s son William, whose descendants today represent one quarter of today's families.

In all in 1860 family members were spread to 55 of Indiana's 92 counties. By location, Morgan Co. leads the list with 23 families, followed by Clinton (16), Vermillion (14), Tippecanoe (13), Fayette (12), Randolph (12), Henry (11) & Miami (10), about 40% of the total distributed families in Indiana. Significantly In 1860, Indiana was the home to more descendants

bearing the Chenoweth name than any other state, this torch being passed from Ohio. Indiana has held this top position in each subsequent published Census through 1930. Though we do not have a way of fully measuring the family today, available phone listings place Indiana 4th on the list, surpassed only by California, Maryland and Texas, each states with significantly larger general populations. Curiously, Indiana is a very rural state without the large urban complexes found in other states. This rural, small city mix very much reflects the early family who settled and farmed the land.

Currently secretary of the Chenoweth Family Association, Joyce was born on January 9, 1941 in Lafayette, IN, a very small community where everyone knew everyone. As a youngster in grade school, she was sick quite often, and spent the greater part of three years in bed with heart problems.

Joyce went to work in the office of a gear manufacturing company before graduating from high school and was married a year later to Richard Wiegand. Within six months Uncle Sam came knocking on the door. After basic training she joined her husband at Ft Bliss in El, Paso, TX. During the two years in El Paso she worked in a bank. After the military obligation was complete, she returned to her former place of employment until 1970 when they adopted their son, Gregory. A requirement of adoption at that time from the agency was she quit work for a year. After staying home for three and a half years, the company asked if she would like to return to work. Her migration story did not go through Louisville, KY like their story did. Later she learned that no one had gone into the DAR under her ancestor Richard Chenoweth, and since he is buried in her county and all generations between them are here, it was an easy lineage to do. The hard part for her was pulling the right Richard from the Chenoweth straw pile. In 1999 she joined the DAR under Richard Chenoweth. Subsequently the local SAR/DAR corrected their records to agree with her research. She has since submitted applications for two other of her four grandparents, a goal she set for herself several years ago. She still lacks some documentation for the last grandparent, but is still looking.

A BRIEF OVERVIEW OF INDIANA

The 19 stars on Indiana's state flag reflect its spot as the 19th state to ratify the U.S. Constitution. Naturally, the state's name means "land of the Indians" in reference to the Native Americans that made the area their home for many centuries Likewise, the state capital Indianapolis (with its Greek suffix) means "City of the Indians."

Although it's been known as the Hoosier State since at least the 1830s, the origin of Indiana's nickname is uncertain. Some believe it came from a preacher named Harry Hoosier, while others claim that the territory's nosy settlers used to yell "Who's here?" when passing a homestead. At least one source claims it refers to "hoo," an old Anglo-Saxon word for "hill." In reference to the southern section of the state. Still, no definitive answer has been found.

Indiana is the smallest of the contiguous states west of the Appalachian Mountains, and its location in between the Eastern and Central Time Zones has long been a source of consternation. Parts of northwest and southwest Indiana use Central Time, while the rest of the state remains in Eastern. And until 2006, parts of Indiana declined to observe Daylight Saving Time in order to keep on the same schedule with nearby cities in other states. With national adjustments to DST in 2007, the confusion continues.

While most U.S. states chose to depict historic symbols on their state quarters, Indiana's 2002 coin is decorated with an image of a modern-day Indy race car. Indianapolis is home to the Indianapolis 500, the world-famous auto race held every Memorial Day weekend.

The political slogan "Tippecanoe and Tyler Too" was based on William Henry Harrison's days as the first governor of the Indiana Territory. In November 1811, Harrison led troops in defusing a Shawnee uprising at Tippecanoe, IN. In 1840, Harrison ran for president with John Tyler as his running mate. They won the election, but Harrison died of pneumonia after only one month in office, leaving Tyler to take the reins of the country.

Another famous phrase that has its roots in Indiana is often erroneously attributed to *New York Tribune* publisher Horace Greely. In 1870, his newspaper prompted thousands of Americans to "Go west, young man." Truth be told, he borrowed the phrase from John Soule, who had printed it in the *Terre Haute Express* in Indiana nearly 20 years earlier.

If one U.S. state is specifically associated with a team sport, it has to be Indiana and basketball. In high school, college, and the pros, the state has been home to some of the hardwood's greatest names, including Larry Bird, Oscar Robertson, Bob Knight, Reggie Miller, Digger Phelps, Ann Meyers, John Wooden, Bobby Plump, Isiah Thomas and Damon Bailey. Of course, one can't mention Indiana sports without discussing the University of Notre Dame in South Bend, which has won NCAA championships in everything from football to fencing.

Famous people born in Indiana include actor James Dean; writers Booth Tarkington, Lew Wallace, Theodore Dreiser, James Whitcomb Riley, Kurt Vonnegut, Jr. and Ernie Pyle; politicians Thomas Marshall, Wendell Wilkie, Eugene V. Debs, and Dan Quayle; labor leader Jimmy Hoffa; choreographer Twyla Tharp; fashion designer Bill Blass; TV host David Letterman; songwriters Hoagy Carmichael and Cole Porter; Inventor siblings Orville and Wilbur Wright; and the Jackson family of entertainers (including Michael and Janet).

[John2] Doing Smiths and Wilsons

A while back, I was contacted by Paul Smith who was interested in the Smith family of Jane Sarah Chenoweth, the daughter of James S. Chenoweth and Martha Smith of Kentucky. Jane had married William Gideon Smith in Johnson Co., IN on June 01, 1830 and the couple had settled there, their farm close to that of her first cousin, James the s/o Thomas. The Smith accounts have Jane coming there to visit her uncle Thomas. James S. Chenoweth at this time was living in Nelson Co., KY, by 1850 he and his wife Martha, both in their 70s, were found staying with Jane and son-in-law, William Smith. Paul descends from the Robert Smith, a brother to William Gideon Smith. Paul gave me information that William Gideon 'Gid' Smith, Jr. had served in the Civil War. I had known that this was true for his 2 older brothers, but this was new information. The Smith family must have been in some angst with their son-in-law, Stephen Trout also in Union uniform, bringing the family's exposure to 4. Gid suffered a gunshot wound in his right leg and died at the age of 43 in Arkansas. He left a widow, Cecilia DeBruhl, who he had married on March 21, 1880 in New Orleans at the age of 36. It is always great to get some information on Smiths. In 4 generations from John Chenoweth's marriage to Mary Smith and his grandson James S. marrying to Martha Smith and Jane marrying to William Gideon Smith, we have 3 Smith connections from 3 separate Smith families. Oy vey!

Paul, having focused my attention, enabled me to find the marriage of Anna Smith to Thomas Buell in Clay Co., IN. Anna was a granddaughter of Jane's by her oldest son John Thomas Smith, who became quite a noteworthy citizen of Clay Co. Paul had that his name was John Thompson Smith, I am not sure how that get's resolved, in most accounts he is John T. Smith. In part his obit said:

"Locally he was a statesman; theologically he was a preacher; biblically he was a Christian, as a man he was a strong exponent in favor of his opinions, but never a foe. He would oppose a man to the bitter all day and then take him home with him for dinner. He had been a teacher in the bible class in the Sunday school of Bowling Green for many years, and was a great inspiration to his pastor every time that he preached to that congregation and he will be missed every Sunday and forever afterwards. He was an indulgent father, a kind husband, a friend to the poor, a helper to the needy, true to his God, and to his convictions. We bid him adieu for a season and then hope to meet him in the sweet bye and bye. Now that he is gone we are lonely. The funeral at Bowling Green, Monday forenoon, March 2, was largely attended. The schools were dismissed and places of business closed, that all might pay their last respects to a man who was loved and esteemed by his neighbors and acquaintances."

The respect paid by John's community speaks loudly as to the regard he was held. I had searched many times for a descendant, but even with Anna and the new found Buells, I have failed to drill to a living descendant. We do have however 8 cousins from two of Jane's other children, Martha Anne Smith who married first Stephen Trout and James Chenoweth 'Chen' Smith who married Ferbia Adaline in Arkansas. One of my first contacts in this family was Roger Floyd Taylor (#69 on the cousin list), who filled out the list on Jane's children from the 3 that are listed in the Harris book to 9.

As usual I kept looking around, kicking tires, and when I got to the family of Jane's cousin Ruhanna who had married Samuel Wilson, I tried looking for Norval Smith in the 1880. I know I had looked back in 2001 with the LDS CD set without success, but this time I could easily sweep the nation and voila I found him and his wife Angeline in Austin, TX, a place I never would have looked. The 1880 listing gave me Angeline's maiden name, Basnett, as her brother and his wife, Gus and Rowenna, were living with them. It appears by the 1850 census that her parents were P.G.L and Lucy Basnett. Norval and Angeline were still in Travis Co. in 1900 and she stated that she had 2 living children, both who were listed in 1870 and 1880. A random Google found a cryptic reference to Norval's daughter Winifred marrying at St. David's Church in Austin to a T. Murray. The link was broken and a PDF file from the Austin genealogy Society would only load 50 pages, while the index referred to listings starting on page 67. Frustrated I tried Winifred Murray in the 1900 Census and found her in New Jersey married to Charles T. Murray with 4 children. I am hopeful that this may eventual get us a descendant. Both sons married and had children. I was able to confirm by an ancestry tree that Winifred was a Wilson and their first born son was Reginald Wilson Murray. I then got sidetracked with a site that had Charles as a Mayflower descendant of Francis Cooke. I know that there are tons of Hannah's Carter line that descend from this same Francis, by Bethany Cook who married James Bowen Carter. Wow, would I be hopelessly bogged down if the Chenoweth's came over on the Mayflower like Shirley Harris first thought. I can't even imagine how big a family that has a 100 year jump back would be. If as well known and documented and prolific you could use a factor of 100 times. Well maybe not, that would be over 25 million people. Gads, it's hard enough just doing

Chenoweths. All in all, an interesting moment! And well any time you back into a marriage for a Smith and Wilson daughter in an afternoon, well that just feels good.

A Caywood moment

Genealogy work, with a file this large never ceases to amaze me. There is always something to learn. Old sources run dry and new gushers are found. Yet when you have been staring at an unknown marriage for over 10 years, the aha moment is a rush. Such was the case of the Illinois marriage of Joseph Caywood to Mary E. Chenoweth on March 04, 1853 in Peoria Co., IL. Of all the loose ends we have, unknown marriages comprise the largest lists. In the "old" days, I relied on Pete for enlightenment. But over the years, with gained knowledge and access to more and more sources, I have been enable to do better analysis. I know I had looked at this one more than once. There was an 1880 listing of a Joseph Caywood in Bureau Co., IL, but he was by this time widowed. We needed some information on Mary. I tried ancestry trees and hit one that had this detail. This tree gave Mary as Mary Ellen with no parents born about 1831. I did a specific search of Bureau Co. in 1860 for Joseph without a surname and spotted a "Cagwood", yes there was Mary, 25 born in Indiana.

The puzzle in all this was that there was no Chenoweth family in Peoria Co. in 1850. If someone was married there, you always look for a hook for why. Whereas men might drift into a town, women were generally with their family. The database focused on just one Mary Ellen born ca 1834, yes in Indiana. What one would call a good fit! Better it was the only fit. Mary Ellen was the daughter of Elias Chenoweth a family from Washington Co., IN. Elias had migrated to Clay Co., IL after 1850, but his brother William had settled in Fulton Co. and Elias was enumerated there in 1840 before returning to Washington Co. Fulton Co. abuts Peoria so it is not too much of a stretch. The Caywoods were in Peoria Co. in 1850. As Elias was on the move, maybe they came to the groom's home, based on a relationship started years earlier. The important part is that it seems reasonable. As I progressed into the family, it helped to come to know that one of Mary Ellen's sons would marry in Clay Co., IL, perhaps because he too had been visiting relatives. Without exact proof, this is about as good as this sort of fit gets. The probability is high.

The 1930 Census revisited

In 2009 I had asked Pete to recompile all the 1900 to 1930 Census work we had accumulated into one master spreadsheet. In 2010 Pete completed this for 1930 and in December 2011 he completed the 1920. As always I am way behind, but I have finished with the basic family tree as found on this new 1930 spreadsheet and conformed it with the all-male Census spreadsheet we have used for years. It was a good exercise as, by bringing the two spreadsheets into sync, I was able to correct some omissions.

What we are doing is something beyond normal genealogy. We have now assembled a glimpse of the entire family in 1930 with some interesting findings. The total spreadsheet for 1930 is 3,789 entries [3,492 bearing the Chenoweth name]. 3,258 are in the main file, 226 in our unknown lines, 115 in from other immigrations and black families, and 190 yet unidentified. The list is made up of 1,866 males and 1,923 females. Removing the other surnames in the household, often from daughter families living in the household and in-laws, the tree distills out to 3,004 Chenoweths in the 1930 tree and 1,499 males. We believe there are about 289 males not found (placing the 1930 find rate at 84.7% at present).

The 2000 Census has 4,699 Chenoweths and 231 Chenowiths. The other variant spellings are too small a population to be included in the Census Bureau's surname list [being under a 100 count]. Our SSA spreadsheet work tells us the sum of these other spelling would be about 6.4% of the total so one can extrapolate that there were 5,267 "Chenoweths" in the US in 2000 vs 3,492 we found in 1930, about a 50% growth over the last 70 years.

In looking at the 1930 Census we broke it down to 4th generation lines. There were 62 lines then carrying the Chenoweth name. Since that time we know that 7 of these have ended and so only 55 4th generation lines exist today with a viable Chenoweth male, closing out 1 line of Richard, 2 for Arthur and 4 for Thomas. Of the 55 lines, what I call the big 7 comprise half the family today. These are the lines of John of Randolph County, WV and his brother William who went to Nelson Co., KY, two other John lines, William who married Catherine Rinker and John who settled in Washington Co., IN, the Richard line of Nicholas and the Arthur lines of William of Hampstead and the William who married Amy Davis in Maryland.

There are a total of 16 John lines from each of his six sons. Richard's line is down to 2 from his son John. These are what I call the Tennessee lines. There are 11 Arthur lines from 4 of his 6 sons and 6 William lines from 2 of his 4 sons. That leaves Thomas with 20 lines from each of the 7 sons. Thomas being the youngest lacks the early generational growth we find in his 4 older brothers. Fourteen of our 55 lines had less than 10 living males in 1930.

This information should help Pete in looking at his DNA spectrum he is trying to test for. So far in ten years we have only acquired 22 of the 55 existing lines. It sure would be nice to have a few more volunteers out there. We have yet to even get a sample from the big line of Cora's Chenoweths from William of Hampstead.

The Chenoweth name was found in 44 of the 48 states that existed in 1930. About 40% of the family resided in the states of Maryland, Indiana, Illinois and Ohio, places early on the family's migration routes. Not all that different from what was already established in the 1850 & 1860 Censuses. Today California would be in that grouping.

The lines of John and Thomas are the only sons to still boast lines from each of their 13 grandsons. The 16 grandsons of Richard, Arthur and William have been reduce to 8, with the best total take in the family of Richard which is down to one. It is likely that the unknown lines of Baltimore, a Gordian Knot still unsliced, would bolster Richard's family. They comprise nearly 90% of what is still unplaced after the assumed placements we made in the spring 2010.
