Again, thank you for the newsletter. Since you appear to be in a researching mood, I have some puzzles for you. While I was at the State Archives, I met a woman from Baltimore. A Mrs Bardwell. 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I don't know why but I read the December 2004 newsletter with much more thoroughness than I usually do. Of the several marriages you listed for John P. (or several John P's as the case may be) the one to Sarah Elizabeth Moore caught my eye. This Sarah was the sister of my great great grandfather, Andrew Jackson Moore. Sarah was born November 25, 1846 in Barbour Co., VA (now WV). She married William Morgan Hamric December 19, 1869. They had seven children. William died in 1891. My source says she married John Chenoweth after William died. The source had no other information on John and did not have his middle initial. Now I am able to add the date of marriage to John P. and his middle initial from your newsletter. It appears that William may have left his wife (in a similar fashion to what John P. may have done with several wives).

My source is the Gilmer County, WV history Book and the contributor of the specific article was Geraldine Marks. Geraldine writes a column in the Glenville Democrat/Pathfinder, a weekly newspaper from Gilmer County. The paper has just this summer begun an online edition. Geraldine does not have an email address. She has a daughter who lives near her who would relay emails. She mentioned your name and the huge Chenoweth database in one of her recent articles, so I assume you may have been in contact with her.

This information probably will not help you in your attempt to solve the John P. enigma. If it does, so much the better. I just wanted to say thanks for the pieces of information that affect me personally. Good newsletter – keep up the good work.

They are found in the 1900 and 1910 Census of Rockbridge Co. The wife is in the 1920 Census same place. The child is not in the 1900 census but Sarah the wife says she has had 1 child and 1 living. In 1910 she says: (md 1x) 8child/5 Liv. I don't have the parents of Andrew Moore. Maybe you could elaborate on this family. It might be a place to hang this "unknown line" with a side connection to the main file.

SARAH ELIZABETH MOORE was born November 25, 1846 in Barbour Co., WV, and died Aft. 1920. She married (1) WILLIAM MORGAN HAMRIC. She married (2) JOHN P. CHENOWETH November 16, 1882 in West Virginia, son of THOMAS CHENOWETH and RACHEL SWANE. He was born December 11, 1822 in Ross Co., OH and died August 2, 1913 in Rockbridge Co., VA

## OH HAPPY DAY - Redux!

By Jon Egge (Cottage Lake, Woodinville, WA) (Descendant of Dr Henry S.5 Chenoweth of Chillicothe, OH) JAMES FRANCIS4, THOMAS3, JOHN2, JOHN1

Greg Wulker made a trip to Champaign Co., OH this week and found the detail on three (3) Champaign County land transactions in 1839 that prove the line of Dr Henry S. Chenoweth and Dr John W. Chenoweth as sons of James Francis, son of Thomas, son of John, son of John. William Safley, the uncle of the children of Rebecca Safley Chenoweth, buys land from Benjamin and Margaret Sharp, Jesse and Sarah Tuttle and Henry S. and John W. Chenoweth. Each describes the land as having been received as heirs of Rebecca Chenoweth to the estate of Henry Safley. These transactions very clearly prove that Sarah, Margaret, Henry S. and John W. were children of Rebecca Chenoweth who married James Francis Chenoweth.

This one deed of Henry and John jointly in part reads:

HS & JW Chenoweth to William Safley -

Know all men that . . Henry S. and John W. Chenoweth of the County of Pickaway, Ohio and the State of Arkansas in consideration of One Hundred and sixty dollars in hand paid by William Safley of the County of Champaign (Ohio) hath bargained and sold and hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said William Safley, his heirs and assigns forward, the following premises estates(?) in the County of Champaign in the State of Ohio and in Goshen Township as follow to wit two twentieth parts of all the real estate and landed property of Henry Safley deceased late of County of Champaign, State of Ohio, aforesaid being the same that was left to us as the heirs at law of Rebecca Chenoweth by the last will and testament of Henry Safley.

JAMES FRANCIS4 CHENOWETH *(THOMAS3, JOHN2, JOHN1)* was born 1774 in Maryland, and died Bef. 1825. He married (1) REBECCA ROBINA SAFLEY August 20, 1799 in Botetourt Co., VA, daughter of HENRY SAFLEY and MARGARET DUNLAP. She was born November 18, 1784 in Rockingham Co., VA and died February 28, 1813 in Botetourt Co., VA. He married (2) NANCY CRAWFORD November 14, 1813 in Botetourt Co., VA, daughter of WILLIAM CRAWFORD. She was born Bet. 1769-1789 and died Unknown.

There is a puzzle yet here. Henry divided his property 4 ways between his 2 sons Adam and William and the heirs of his two deceased daughters: Sarah Snodgrass and Rebecca Chenoweth. Son Henry was not included. This means Rebecca's share was 25% and the 3 land transactions covering Sarah, Margaret, Henry S. and John W. are 4/20ths or 20%. There must be one other child, probably Thomas, though I don't know what happened yet to his share. Sarah Margaret, Henry S. and JohnW. sold their shares at \$80 each for \$320. Adam sold his share to

William for \$400. Again the \$80 difference indicated an additional heir in Rebecca's share. I assume the Thomas is the Thomas we have who moved down to Virginia from Ohio after he married. This bears further investigation.

Common Pleas Court, 1<sup>st</sup> of January 1839, Will was produced by William Safley and witnesses John Owens and Hiram Doty, \$1100 bond entered by William Safley and Elizabeth Safley, widow. (transcribed by Greg Wulker)

- 1) I will and bequeath my soul to God who gave it, and my body to its mother earth, to be interred by my living friends in a plain, decent and Christian like manner.
- 2) I will all my debts, funeral and other expenses be paid out of my estate by my executor.
- 3) I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Safley all my household furniture and bedding, one cow of her own choosing, four head of sheep, and one hundred dollars and all my clapboard house.
- 4) I will and bequeath unto my son William Safley \$100, to my son Adam Safley \$150 dollars, and to my son Henry Safley \$10 dollars to be paid out of my personal estate and the balance of my estate both real and personal, I will to be divided equally between my two sons William and Adam Safley and my two daughters, late Sarah Snodgrass and Rebecca Chenoweth, both deceased which will is to be understood that the legal heirs of said Sarah and Rebecca deceased are to have their deceased mother's interest equally divided amongst them.
- 5) I hereby nominate, constitue and appoint my son William Safley sole executor, signed Henry Safley dated 3<sup>rd</sup> of February 1838, witnesses: John Owens and Hiram Doty.

## **Civil War Remembered**

Contributed by Edmund P. Willis (Alexandria, VA) the following is a letter describing an event during the Civil War involving the family of Lemuel Chenoweth of Beverly, WV (the noted bridge builder) and his great grandfather.

Christmas Evening December 25<sup>th</sup> 1878

Mrs. Mollie Chenoweth Weymouth

My dear Madam:

This evening fifteen years ago we met for the first time. You may have forgotten it, but it was a bright spot in a dark epoch of my life and will never be forgotten by me. It was a cold Christmas day and after a long tiresome march I entered Beverly under guard, a prisoner of war, about three o'clock in the afternoon. It was the first time my eyes had ever rested on the old town and I thought at the time, under the peculiar circumstances of my condition, and the feeling of loneliness and despondency which oppressed me, that it was the most desolate looking place that I ever saw.

I was taken up to Gen. Averill's [page 2] headquarters and the General very generously offered to release me on parole for the night if I desired to stay with any of my acquaintances. Alas, I didn't know a single person in the whole town. Verily I was a stranger in a strange land, and I told the General so. At this point the noble, good fellow, Tom Edwards stepped up and told me that he knew a family of Southern people in the place who would be glad to accommodate me and offered to accompany me to the house of your father.

I accepted his offer gladly and as I recall the incident you may remember our appearance when we entered your house late that afternoon. I recollect distinctly as if it had been yesterday, the cordial greeting [page 3] your family gave me, and as we fathered around the bright fire in the grate I felt that for the time I had been permitted to stop in Paradise. I also remember in the same connection the Christmas supper your Mother had prepared for us, particularly the fine fat turkey which your mother informed me she had prepared for the Christmas dinner, but learning that Averill was to reach Beverly that day it occurred to her that perhaps he might have some poor Rebel prisoner with him, and she reserved the turkey with the hope that she might have the gratification of sharing it with some Confederate. I know one Johnny Reb who made her heart glad by eating a memorable meal from that gobbler, but then after supper all of us, your father, mother, yourself and sisters, Tom Edwards and myself, gathered in the cozy little parlor and while the [page 4] cheerful fire glowed and sparkled in the grate in defiance of the storm which raged without, we had a long talk of old times "away down South in Dixie."

I detailed to you a running history of events as they were occurring within the Confederate lines, and you in turn related to me the troubles and difficulties you had to contend with inside the lines of the enemy. I remember, too, how tenderly you spoke of the death of your gallant brother, Maj Chenoweth, who fell at Port Republic. We had a great deal to talk about, of friends in the Southern army, of friends who had refugeed South, of friends who had befriended you when a refugee yourself, and although I remained with you the next day and the next night we didn't get through talking.

Fifteen years have passed since then, but as I sit at my desk tonight writing [page 5] this letter the whole scene rises up before me as inviolate as a thing of the present, and I am fain to permit my mind to dwell there.

But as all bright dreams have their waking to a darker real life, so my pleasant sojourn at your home was cut short, and on the second morning I resumed my march towards a northern prison. I have not forgotten your continued kindness and the pleasant gleams of light, which your letters proved to me, penetrating the gloom of my prison hours at Fort Delaware. I have never ceased to think of you, and as in time to time as opportunity presented I have made inquiries as to yourself and your father's family. I had not learned of your marriage, however, until a few days ago. I received a letter from your husband in which he informed me that his wife was no other than the noble-hearted little woman who so generously contributed to my wants in the days when I [page 6] was "hard up," but I hope that I may be able by my vote and influence to contribute something toward securing the position for your husband, and thus in a small way contribute something in return for the kindness of his wife.

I do not know how old time has served you in all the years that have intervened since the time of our meeting, but I hope you have fared well at his hands. To me they have brought a varied experience, I have had a fierce contest in the battle of life. Wrestling with Fate, sometimes under, but more frequently on top, and taking all in all I have just cause for thankfulness that I have succeeded as well as I have. I am comfortable domiciled with a reasonable share of earthly comfort, have a most excellent wife and three bright little cherubs- two girls and a boy – to gladden our home. For several years I have been in bad health – at one time despaired of ever being well again, but now [page 7] think that I will be restored to the vigor of my younger manhood.

Just think of it – fifteen years have passed by since you took me beneath the shelter of your home, and it seems as but a day ago. I was a boy then, and now am settled down into mature manhood-taking a retrospect of the years that are gone. What numberless pictures hang on the walls of the Past! In some respects the years have proved hard teacher – in others, they picture to me "faces beaming with many a smile from the bowels of memory's magical isle." As I call up these forms from the tomb of the vanquished years what varied shadows they cast on memory's wall. There are pictures of bitter pain, ashen memories, and crushed hopes. There are recollections of strong passions and wild ambitions when the heart of the child is crushed in the breast of the struggling man; but, there are also other pictures more blessed one, pictures of quiet, peace, and domestic love: and joys arising from faith and truth: kisses of children on cheek and lip: and there [page 8] is also a tender one thru all, it is a little grave, and a mourning for the pressure of tender life and the light of eyes darkened in death's eclipse.

"How the winters are drifting like flakes of snow, and the summers like birds between, And the years in the sheaf-so they come and they go On the river's breast with its ebb and flow As it glides in the shadow and gleams."

In the quiet of my room this Xmas night I have lived over again the Christmas of fifteen years ago - 1863 - and the years that have followed, but I know that I am wearying you so I will close.

I hope Mrs Weymouth (I can hardly resist saying Miss Mollie) that your future may be bright and happy, and when the death shadows at last shut out the light of life may you find shelter in that home where neither storms, nor war, nor even death can come. And may you then find the full joy and truth of the Scripture. "Even as you have (done) it unto one of these little ones ye have done it unto me,"

Mrs Moffett joins me in best wishes, and we have that both of us may yet meet you and thank you in person for your kindness to me – Always your friend.

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## **BOOK REVIEW**

Though not a literary critic, I do enjoy a good book. Every now and then I prefer something other than a "classic". I recently purchased one of those "other" books and even though the reason I purchased was because it was written by my cousin, James Harvey Chenoweth, Jr, I highly recommend it to anyone with an interest in law enforcement.

James, born of missionary parents on the Chinese-Tibetan border in 1922, was a police officer, Chief Deputy U.S. Marshal, a Treasury agent and a Congressional investigator. His latest book, "*Down Darkness Wide*.", tells of his exploits as one of the last frontier US Marshal's in the Third Judicial Division in the Territory of Alaskan, from 1951 to its becoming a state in 1960.

James' previous venture into literary waters was a unique book, "Oddity Odyssey: A Journey Through New England's Colorful Past". This book masquerades as a guided tour through each of New England's six states – Vermont, New Hampshire, Maine, Massachusetts, Rhode Island and Connecticut. Having lived in New England from 1989-1994, I can only say that I wish this book had been available then as it brings the country side alive with little publicized oddities.

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## SONS OF JOHN1 - William

(3<sup>rd</sup> Installment of a series) By Jon Egge

This is the third in a series of newsletter articles about the sons and daughters of the original family. Both Chenoweth histories give William short shrift. Cora Hiatt covered William's family in one page. In the Harris book there are only 14 pages used to cover his family. Even so, 4of these pages are wrong. But there are another 24 of William's lines in the book that are misplaced under other sections. The net effect would be a 34-page section. Now much more of William's family has been restored. William is no longer the "runt" of the family. That honor now belongs to Richard, but Richard and William combined do not equal any of their three other brothers. William was the second son to have a recorded land purchase and the first in Virginia. He settled along Mill Creek in present day Berkeley Co., WV. At the time it was part of Frederick Co., VA. He married an Ann, who, according to Betty Cruishanks, was Ann Polk.

William did, in numbers, have the smallest family of the five brothers, 4 sons and 3 daughters. Unlike his brothers, William, except for his own name, did not use any of the family names for his sons. There were Joseph, Absolom, Isaac and William, Jr. The son, Joseph, died at the age of 40, just months before William himself, leaving a son and a daughter, called "Newly" who would be Eleanor. Joseph's wife remarried to Dr. Evan Banes and took her family to Ohio just after the turn of the 19<sup>th</sup> century. This was Sarah "Sina" Hayes, one of two daughters of John Hays, a neighbor of William's, who married Chenoweth brothers. The other, as discovered by Greg Wulker, was Anne Hayes who married Absolom. Absolom is only a name in the Chenoweth books. Through research of Greg and another cousin, Joanne Swartz, we have determined that he had at least 3 daughters and probably 1 son. The land that William lived on was divided upon his death between his two sons, Absolom and William, Jr. Absolom sold his half in 1809 and headed for Ohio, passing through Washington Co., PA and settling in Clark Co., OH. Absolom died there as the result of a fall from a horse when he was drunk, thus resulting in his daughter Eleanor, and her daughter Sarah becoming involved in the temperance movement.

The William, Jr. who resided on the other half of William's land, sold his parcel about 1813 and went to Warren Co., OH. This William is wrongly depicted in the Chenoweth books. His wife was not Nellie Skelly and the listed children in Cora's book had no life except the one called James Mathias. This James turns out to be a duplication of the son of John(3), the James that settled in Perry Co., OH with his 2 brothers. It is all wrong. Actually William, Jr, as proven by land deeds in Berkeley Co., was the William who married Elizabeth Hutchinson, misplaced as a son of John(3). Of all the sons of William, the family of William, Jr. is the largest and most robust. There were 4 sons and 6 daughters. Thomas the oldest, misplaced as a son of Richard, Jr., went to Clark Co., OH. The other three, William, Absolom and John, were part of the 3 cousin marriage with the daughters of William S. Chenoweth of Back Creek, Frederick Co., MD and settled with William, Jr. in Warren Co. It was this very William S., the son of John(3) by his first marriage to Mary Smith, that William, Jr. was mistakenly substituted for by Cora Hiatt, causing William S. to be in turn misplaced and misunderstood for years. Upon his death William, Jr. divided his lands in Warren Co. among his three sons who settled there. His will describes this trisection at painstaking length. Many families of these three sons and cousin wives still live in this same area of Ohio today.

Isaac also died young, at age 40. He had a known family of 5 children, 3 daughters and 2 sons. All would end up in Ohio, most with a preceding stop and stay in Pennsylvania. Isaac's youngest son Isaac J. was born after his death and is not mention in the minor guardianship hearings that followed Isaac's death. This has caused some to question the line. But Isaac J. is mentioned in the division and shares of Isaac's land after his death and is an authentic son of Isaac.

The lines of daughters of William have been equally shrouded. Though mentioned in William's will, their married names were not given. The only one we have a good knowledge of now is Mary who married Abraham Sutton and went with him to Fort Cumberland and then Washington Co., PA. It is believed that the daughter Hannah married Samuel Dunham and Anne married Daniel Wilson, but neither is clear cut.

### **Christmas Presents**

The ebb and flow of the website is constant. Holidays can be sometimes slow or sometimes sizzling as people have time to go on-line. This December and January (04-05) three excellent contacts were made. The first was from Kay Bogart of Newark, DE. She had sent to Bill Chinworth for a copy of the Harris book and Bill faithfully forwarded her letter on to me. Kay's husband is from the Baltimore line of Washington Chenoweth and his wife Sidney Alvera Noohan. This line is thin and rare. Washington was the oldest son of Benjamin Norris Chenoweth. Benjamin's line is the only one we know of today from Thomas Chenoweth, the misplaced son of Richard(2) of Baltimore Co. We have so few early daughter lines in Baltimore, and this one is sixth generation. Thomas lived in Harford Co. as did Benjamin and Washington. Washington and his family are found in the 1850 Census of Harford Co. but we had drawn blanks as to what had happened next. Kay's message spurred me to find Sidney in the 1860 and 1870 Censuses. Apparently Washington died leaving Sidney a widow and living with her parents in 1860. Kay has supplied us with the marriage of the daughter Gertrude to John George. In 1880 she and her husband are living Cecil Co. with 4 children, one of whom, Emma Laura George, was the great grandmother of Kay's husband, Barry. I am looking forward to exchanging more information with Kay.

Joyce Wiegand prompted the next discovery. In her effort to track down daughter lines of Richard Chenoweth of Tippecanoe Co., IN [one of seven sons of Thomas(2)]. Joyce found Ruth's daughter Sarah living in Clay Co., IN in the 1850 Census. Early on in the life of the website, Joyce had acquired the estate papers of Richard who died on December 28, 1847. This material was instrumental in correcting mistakes in this line. It helped identify Richard'' son Arthur, who is found in the unknown page section of the Harris book. Richard's daughter Martha married John Davis. Harris has William Darby, who in reality married Sarah Chenoweth the daughter of Absolom Chenoweth and Nellie Reed. The daughter Ruth married Samuel Findley. This marriage was heretofore unknown. Ruth had died before her father so the estate dealt with Ruth's three Findley children: James B., Richard, and Sarah. Whereas we have not located the two sons, Sarah was known by the estate as the widow of John Powders remarried to William Huffman. It was these name combinations that confirmed to Joyce the Census information she had found as both Powders and Huffman children were living with Sarah in Clay Co., IN in 1850. Subsequent Census work by Joyce found the Powders going to Iowa and then Missouri. The 1930 Census got us close enough to try to find some living descendants, which I was able to do after receiving the research from Joyce. This eventually led to Carrol Powders of Louisiana who is a great, great grandson of John Powders and Sarah Findley. Carroll has done a good deal of research on the Powders family and was delighted to connect this back to the Chenoweths. This is a blossoming of the lines of a 4<sup>th</sup> generation daughter.

The third contact came this January from Clarence Joe Freeland of Texas. Joe is a descendant of Sarah Chenoweth and Jacob Sheets. This is another thin line from Archibald Chenoweth, the only other son of John Chenoweth and Francis Haile that give us lines to present day. We know very little of Archibald. For reasons unknown he married in Berkeley Co., VA, a place where we find many Chenoweths, but none of the Baltimore line of Richard. It maybe that Archibald was on some sort of visitation to the two Arthur families of John and Samuel that were 1<sup>st</sup> cousins to his father John. It is likely that the Barnes family of Prudence Barnes lived in this area. But how Archibald met her, while his mother lived in Washington Co., TN is unknown. Archibald and Prudence did go to Tennessee, settling in Sullivan Co. neighboring to the Haile and Chenoweths that were in Washington Co. By 1840 they had moved over to Washington Co. as well. We know only two children from this marriage, Ezekial and Sarah. Ezekial married Sarah Jobe and his descendants today spell their name Chinouth. Linda Dohse Karrow, who descends from this line found us through the reunion site in the fall of 2000. Now Joe brings detail to Ezekial's sister Sarah. We had known that Sarah married Jacob Sheets and moved to Hardin Co., KY. Neither made it to the 1850 Census but we did have a list of children from the Harris book. SARAH5 CHENOWETH (*ARCHIBALD4, JOHN3, RICHARD2, JOHN1*) was born 1805 in Maryland, and died 1840 in Hardin Co., KY. She married JACOB SHEETS March 29, 1827 in Washington Co., TN, son of DANIEL SHEETS and ELIZABETH?. He was born 1804 in Maryland, and died 1844.

Earlier I had found an 1880 Census listing Eldridge Sheets that looked likely in Hill Co., TX. Peter Chenoweth had supplemented this with some follow-on Census work, but we still lacked positive proof of the linkage. Joe Freeland has provided that in contacting us, confirming the same information we had in question. I look forward to adding in this first line of the Sheets of Sarah. The website has once again worked it's magic in its window on the world.

### Jonathan Paul – "first sign-in"

The first "signed-in" cousin to the site was Jonathan Paul of Salinas, CA. We had met on the internet the previous fall when I found his web page on the Chenoweth family. This was 1995 and the website had not yet been launched. I was in the process of learning how to make webpages and just getting interested in genealogy. Back, then, spam was still canned meat. Today Jonathan graciously hosts the GenHTML version of the database. It was Jonathan that explained to me Buckey's theory on Mary Calvert and urged me to get a copy of his book. He also introduced me to the Harris book, which I obtained as well. Jonathan's help and encouragement over the years has been of great benefit to me. We finally met at the first reunion in Bowling Green.

Unbeknownst to me at the time, Jonathan also gave me the first correction to the Harris book. It concerned his ancestor Arthur, the son of the Arthur who died in Bartholomew Co., IN. Cora had listed this Arthur (Jonathan's ancestor), as he was one of the children included in Arthur's bible, but she gave no further information other than his date of birth. For some strange reason, Shirley Harris had him married in Baltimore to an Anne Clark. At the time, his father Arthur was still thought to be Arthur, Jr. from Baltimore, but still the placement was very puzzling. Jonathan had written Richard Harris about this mistake, but he could not get Richard to make the change. It made no sense whatsoever that this Arthur would be back in Baltimore. His father Arthur had taken his family to Kentucky in the 1780s about the time his son Arthur was born, so Arthur, the son, grew up in Kentucky.

Jonathan Paul said that Arthur(4) married Elizabeth Edmonson and is found in the 1830, 1840 and 1850 Censuses of Bartholomew Co., IN. Harris had found him under the name Havilah, and listed him in the unknown section, but he had also included some of Arthur's life and existence in Indiana while still insisting that he was married to Anne Clark. Havilah, seems to have been some sort of a nickname, maybe to differentiate him from his father, Arthur, Sr who would eventually be corrected to be the son of John(2). Jonathan's research opened to a broad well-defined descendant family. The marriage that Harris had used back in Baltimore appears to be Arthur the son of Richard(3), the son of Arthur(2). This Arthur was from Richard's first marriage and Arthur appears to have died shortly after the marriage. There were two children who apparently assumed the Clark name.

It was some months later that Pete queried me about this alteration and I began to examine it. I had entered it into the database before receiving the Harris book and had not yet reached the place where I would have noticed it was a radical departure. Pete in examining the detail identified these families under the unknown listing of Havilah in the Harris book, greatly clarifying the picture. Much later, when the error in the placement of Arthur, Sr became evident to me, I used Jonathan Paul as a sounding board for my arguments. It was a very significant change and one that would lead to other discoveries about who was really Arthur, Jr. and the correction of several other 3<sup>rd</sup> generation lines in Baltimore.

Actually there has been a third correction to this family. It is now apparent that Arthur(4), aka Havilah, remarried after the death of Elizabeth to a Jackealina Wall. Harris has this marriage, but again gives it to a wrong Arthur, a nephew of Arthur(4) and a son of Rachel and Abraham (Rachel was Arthur's sister). This marriage in turn solved another unknown, William Newton Chenoweth who I finally realized was the son of Arthur and his 2<sup>nd</sup> wife Jackealina. Jonathan's work has been a real asset to helping correct a series of errors involving these families of Bartholomew Co., IN.

### Bobbie Glyn "Bob" Derryberry: Definitely not Robert

Bob Derryberry was the first Chenoweth cousin I found. This was about 1992 long before I even knew what the internet was. I had just puchased a new Gateway PC with a modem and subscribed to Prodigy. The bulletin boards on Prodigy burbled with life. I was fascinated by the various boards and posts. Eventually I found a genealogy board and there was Bob, a Chenoweth descendant, exchanging information with others under the Chenoweth surname. I knew a little about the Chenoweths, having a copy of Cora Hiatt's book passed down from my mother, who had passed away in 1981.

After a time Bob offered me a gedcom file that he was working on. His one hesitation was that I reciprocate in some way when I was able. He told me had been "burned too many times" in the past by sending the file and then never hearing anything back. I assured him this would not be the case. A week or so later I received a diskette in the mail. This was before attached file exchanges were common place and way before the spammers and viruses of today. The file opened into some kind of a DOS program and I soon lost interest. About the same time Prodigy decided they would start charging for on line time of over 40 hours a month. It radically altered things and the boards began to die. Internet users as a group are very averse to paying for things. I got on to other pursuits. I "burned" Bob.

In 1995 I began to get interested in the internet. I was in the process of closing down our construction company and drifting into retirement. The browser had now taken shape and I wanted to learn how to make webpages. Having a good background in basic programming, HTML coding was simple to pick up. I started searching the internet for ideas for a webpage. One of the things I found was genealogy pages, and I thought to myself, "Hey, I could do that". So I started to make my family tree page. One of the things I did was go to the US Census bureau page and find out how common each surname was in this tree I gleaned from my mother's books. Some names were so unusual they did not register among the 88,000 plus surname database. One of these was the maiden name of my father's mother: Laprath. I had never met anyone named Laprath. Chenoweth ranked #6,272<sup>nd</sup> on the list. Laprath didn't even register. I then tried a national phone disc and found there were only about 21 listings for Lapraths in the whole United States. There were 1,779 listings for Chenoweth. I got curious and wrote a letter and sent it to each Laprath address. I think Peter has written the 1,700 Chenoweths, but that is another story.

To make the story short, I got hooked into genealogy through my pursuit of the Laprath family and finding my grandmother's roots. In the process I finally purchased a genealogy program from Broderbund, Family Tree Maker. It was far easier than the awkward spreadsheets I was using. I did a Laprath webpage and then on a whim picked up Bobbie Blyn's diskette. It opened to a database of about 1,000 Chenoweths. I started adding in names from Cora Hiatt's book. That December I purchased Broderbond's WFT Vol #1 CD to find a single listing of a Rose Laprath. I found many Chenoweths , so I started adding them in as well. Flush with success from my Laprath pages, I thought I would launch a Chenoweth page as well. I had little inkling of what the extra 170 years between an 1870 and a circa 1700 immigration would mean. I was in short order found and beset by Chenoweths.

Back to Bob! Feeling a good deal of guilt for "Burning" Bob, I set out to track him down. Bob lives in Garland, TX and I finally reached him in a phone call. He had in the meantime written a book on the Derryberrys. He had given up Email as too time consuming while writing his book. Bob had started a similar pursuit of the Chenoweths but upon discovering the Harris book had lost interest. I was just in the process of acquiring this asset myself. I purchased one of Bob's Derryberry books as well and he sent me his working Chenoweth file, which was a lengthy word document. About a year later Bob came back online and we have exchanged information on occasion when either of us discovered bits of interest in the line of Benjamin Franklin Chenoweth. This 4<sup>th</sup> generation Chenoweth was the son of Thomas, Jr. and Bob's ancestor by the daughter of Sarah who married Henry Derryberry. Sarah was not in the Harris book on Chenoweths, one of many missed daughters in the 3<sup>rd</sup> through the 5<sup>th</sup> generation. Bob has also been helpful with some Texan Chenoweths. He came to the Reunion in Elkins, but I had little opportunity to sit down with him.

I shall always consider Bob's work as the base start for the Chenoweth database. His generosity has served us all well. The website now has a page for Sarah and her Derryberrys. Sarah's sister Elizabeth married John Derryberry, again a case of two sisters marrying two brothers.

Returning from a birthday dinner for my wife, Deanna, I received an obit from Dot Tucker-Houk for Eugene Victor "Gene" Chenoweth, who died a week prior on June 22, 2004 in Indianapolis, Marion Co., IN. Gene was a remarkable individual. I contacted him by letter several years ago. His line was from Ephraim B. Chenoweth of Morgan Co., IN. Gene had a broad knowledge of the family and had corresponded with many other individuals. He sent me a box of material he had collected over the years which included a copy of a letter that Thomas H. Smith wrote in 1884 that added some wonderful detail to the family of John(3), son of Thomas. Gene was delighted with our placement and proofs of his ancestor Ephraim as a son of Absolom, Jr.

At the time I met Gene he had an eye disorder that only allowed him to read very large print. He would write me letters in large block print, musing on the origins of John Chenoweth. Upon reading the background material I sent, he wrote me a letter detailing his imagined life and activity of John upon his arrival in America. I will forever be grateful for his help and ideas. Gene's fond wish was that everyone in the family would correct the surname spellings to "Chenoweth" and get away from all the variations that had developed. Gene thought them messy. In reality, now that we have them identified, they are helpful clues as to who is who.

At the Beaverton Reunion, I was able to meet Michael Frederic Chenoweth, a nephew of Gene's, who lives in Florida. He and his wife Pamela are both lawyers, active environmentalists and still ranting about the 2000 election in "Chadland". Whereas we are apparently from different poles of the political spectrum, we had a common respect for this wonderful Chenoweth, Eugene Victor. I suspect now that Gene is acquainting himself with his forefather John and finding out the real story to the mystery we all still wonder about.
